






tanding at the corner of Burgundy and Mandeville for more than 150 years, what was once Sts. Peter and Paul Church is now a historic and charming experience for all New Orleans visitors known as Hotel Peter & Paul. The 19th-century site consists of four buildings—the church, the rectory, the schoolhouse, and the convent-all of which have been transformed into a hotel that includes 71 guest rooms, a retail space, meeting and events facilities, an ice cream parlor, and a café. From using color palettes that were common in religious paintings and tapestries in the 14th through 18th centuries to incorporating many of the buildings' original features into the

new aesthetic, the hotel's design was thoughtfully and carefully executed by the firm ASH NYC.

Located in the historic, mixed-use neighborhood, Marigny, the hotel sits just off the Mississippi River and is surrounded by the area's colorfully painted Creole cottages, live music venues, and laid-back bars. The food and beverages offered at Hotel Peter & Paul are provided by the Bacchanal Group and are heavily influenced by the vibrant neighborhood. Fusing its New World location with its Old-World roots and charm, The Elysian Barnamed for the "Elysian Fields" in classic mythology—is located in the hotel's former rectory.
